Subject FJA Resolution

To Members of the Federal Judges Association:

In response to the Booker decision of the Supreme Court and the probability of a too prompt response by some members of Congress, the Board of Directors of the Federal Judges Association has adopted the following:

The Board of Directors of the Federal Judges Association has resolved that the position of the FJA should be to ask Congress to allow the present situation time to work, and only if it does not ultimately work to the satisfaction of Congress, should Congress then proceed, in consultation with the Courts, academics, the Justice Department, and other interested parties, to fashion some changes.
