WHEREAS, the members of the federal judiciary have the extraordinary responsibility for making decisions in legal matters which have an immense effect on our nation, its citizens, and the economy; and

WHEREAS, the men and women who serve as federal judicial officers for the State of West Virginia provide their knowledge and expertise in a fair and equitable manner to all parties who appear before them; and

WHEREAS, The West Virginia Bar Association, consisting of numerous attorneys who regularly practice in the federal court system, promotes improving the administration of justice and increasing the level of available legal services; and

WHEREAS, The West Virginia Bar Association is aware that members of the federal judiciary are currently substantially underpaid and, as a consequence, deserve an increase in their salary levels.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that The West Virginia Bar Association, through its Executive Council, does hereby express its unqualified support for a prompt and significant increase in salary for members of the federal, and urges that legislation be enacted during the current session of the United States Congress.
